PTE. HUBERT GENTLE.- Mr. S. Gentle, C.C., and Mrs. Gentle, of 95, East-road, have received news that their third son, Pte. Hubert Gentle, of the King's Company, Grenadier Guards, was killed in action on Sept. 27th. His commanding officer, writing to Mrs. Gentle, says: "I am glad to say he did not suffer, being killed instantaneously by a shell. I wish to convey to you my very deepest sympathy in your terrible bereavement. Your son bore himself most gallantly on the day, and we all deeply regret his loss." Pte. Gentle, who was 30 years of age, enlisted in November, 1916, and went out to France in June, 1917. He was home on leave in August last and returned on the 21st. This is the second son Mr. and Mrs. Gentle have lost in the war. Gunner Owen Gentle, of the R.G.A., having been killed in action on Sept. 13th of last year. The eldest son, Corpl. Daniel Gentle, is with the Expeditionary Force canteens in Salonica, and the second son, Councillor Walter S. Gentle, was discharged immediately after mobilisation.
