LIEUTENANT M. G. WARLAND

Much regret has been occasioned in Cambridge at the news that Second Lieut M G Warland, youngest son of Mrs Warland, of 6, Guest-road, has died of wounds in Mesopotamia. Second Lieut Warland was educated at the Perse School, and enlisted in the Lancers at the outbreak of war. He had a few months' training in Ireland and then secured his commission in the Wilts Regiment. He went out to France, but was invalided home. Regaining his health he was sent to Mesopotamia. Second Lieut Warland was 25 years of age.
