FUNERAL OF MR. HUNNYBUN.

The funeral of the late Mr. Thomas Hunnybun, who died on Dec. 1st., at 8, Glisson-road, Cambridge, took place on Friday afternoon. The service was held at Holy Trinity Church at 2.30, and was conducted by the Rev. F. S. Laurence (Vicar), assisted by the Rev. H. L. C. de Candole (Vicar of Clifton, and a former vicar of Trinity parish), and the Rev. A. Hammond. The interment took place at Mill-road Cemetery.

The principal mourners were: Mr. T. Hunnybun (son), Miss C. Hunnybun and Miss E. Hunnybun (daughters), Mr. Gerald Hunnybun (cousin), Miss M. Hunnybun (granddaughter), Mr. Adams (niece[*sic*]), the Rev. J. R. Elliott and Mr. C. W. Elliott (brothers-in-law), Mr. Lilley, Mr. Sanders and Mr. Holt (friends).

The coffin was of polished oak, with brass fittings, and the inscription on the breastplate was as follows:

THOMAS HUNNYBUN,
Died December 1st, 1913,
Aged 83 years.

A number of beautiful wreaths were laid on the grave, the inscriptions being as follows: From his sorrowing wife, children and grandchildren; With deepest sympathy, from Florence and Ada; In loving remembrance of dear Uncle, from Margie and Phil; With truest sympathy, from the Rev. H. L. C. and Mrs. de Candole, The Vicarage, Clifton; With very real sympathy, from Mrs. F. S. Laurence and the Vicar, Holy Trinity Vicarage, Cambridge; With deepest sympathy, from Mr. and Mrs. C. W. Elliott, The Bungalow, Biggleswade; With deepest sympathy, from Mr. and Mrs. James Sanders, Roselea, 14, Glisson-road, Cambridge; With deepest sympathy, from Mrs. Diver.

Messrs. Eaden Lilley and Co. carried out the funeral arrangements.
