## **THE LATE PTE. T. GEORGE.**

### **Cambridge Soldier's Death in Colchester Hospital.**

We regret to announce the death, which took place in the Colchester Military Hospital on Monday, of Pte. T. George, the 19-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. T. George, of 121, Cavendish-road, Romsey Town. Pte. George joined the Army on the 1st of September, enlisting in the 8th Battalion of the Suffolk Regt. When in Cambridge Pte. George was employed as an apprentice to the printing trade by Messrs. Fabb and Tyler, of Guildhall-street. Death took place from heart failure consequent upon pneumonia.

The body, enclosed in a polished elm coffin, wrapped in the Union Jack, was brought to Cambridge on Wednesday. The coffin was borne to the North Station, Colchester, on a gun carriage lent by the 13th Reserve Cavalry Regt.

The funeral will take place at Mill-road Cemetery at three o'clock this afternoon.
