

MATCH TRIBUTE TO "TOM"

Players and Crowd Observe Silence

As a tribute to the memory of Tom Hayward, the great Surrey and England batsman, whose funeral took place at Mill-road Cemetery, Cambridge, this afternoon, play was suspended at half-past two in the match between Kent and Surrey at Blackheath.

For a minute the players on the field, the Surrey men, who came out of the pavillion, and the spectators, numbering about 4,000 stood in silence.

About 60 people attended the funeral. Among them were Mr. "Ernie" Hayes, the old Surrey cricketer, Mr. Alec Nelson, and Mr. W. A. Cook, representing the Surrey County Cricket Club, Cambs. Cricket Association, and several village clubs were represented.
