THE LATE MISS PRYOR. Funeral at Cambridge.

The funeral of Miss Esther Susannah Pryor, of 1, Gresham-road, took place on Tuesday [8 July]. Miss Pryor died at Eastbourne on July 3rd, at the age of 71, and the body was brought by train to her brother's residence in Gresham-road, where it remained until interment at Mill-road Cemetery. The funeral service held at St. Paul's Church was conducted by the Rev. Dr. Stokes, assisted by the Rev. F. G. Marriott and the Rev. J. Yorke Batley. The hymns sung were "I know that my Redeemer liveth," "Peace, perfect peace," "If I depart I will send Him unto you," and "O rest in the Lord."
