## THE LATE MISS M. G. KENNEDY.

### Funeral at Cambridge.

---

The ashes of the late Miss Marion Kennedy were interred at Mill-road Cemetery on Friday afternoon, after a funeral service at St. John's College Chapel. The body was cremated at Golder's Green Crematorium on Tuesday, and the remains were brought to Cambridge on Thursday.

The service in St. John's Chapel was attended by a large number of well-known ladies and members of the University, among whom Miss Kennedy had worked. The service was conducted by the Dean of the College, the Rev. H. F. Stewart. The Master read the lessons. The choir met the coffin at the door, and chanted the opening sentences. The choir also rendered as an anthem "Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord." The hymn "O God our help in ages past" was also sung.

The coffin was of polished oak, with brass fittings. The breastplate bore the inscription:

MARION GRACE KENNEDY,  
Born November 23rd, 1836,  
Died January 11th, 1914.
